# **CONTINUITY of OPERATIONS PLAN (COOP)**

**Arlington Public Schools** 

### A. INTRODUCTION:

By the beginning of the 2021-22 school year, each district must develop, maintain and when needed, implement a continuity of operations plan that ensures the delivery of basic education program services during disruptions to the basic education program due to an emergency disaster as defined in RCW 38.52.010. An emergency may also include a national declaration of emergency by an authorized federal official.

This Continuity of Operations Plan (COOP) is a component of the District's Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan under RCW 38.52.030.

#### C. OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Ensure the essentials functions can be performed under all conditions
- 2. Reduce a loss of life and minimize property damage and loss
- 3. Execute a successful order of succession with accompanying authorities in the event of disruption renders the district's leadership unable, unavailable, or incapable of assuming or performing their authorities and responsibilities
- 4. Reduce or mitigate disruptions to operations
- 5. Ensure the Arlington School District has facilities where it can continue to perform essential functions as appropriate.
- 6. Protect essential facilities, equipment, records, and other assets.
- 7. Achieve the district's timely and orderly recovery, and reconstitution from the emergency.

#### G. THE SCHEDULE FOR ROUTINE REVIEW OF THE CONTINUITY OF OPERATIONS PLAN BY THE DISTRICT:

This plan will be formally reviewed at least annually by the Board and more often if needed. Revisions to processes and protocols will be ongoing.

### H. THE FOLLOWING WILLAPPLY DURING IMPLEMENTATION OF THE CONTINUITY OF OPERATION PLAN:

- 1. Days in which instructional hours are offered will count as schools days for the purpose of meeting the` requirements of RCW 28A.150.220
- 2. Nothing in this section supersedes other applicable law.

#### I. REVIEW:

The State Board of Education and OSPI may review at their discretion. The District's compliance with the requirements of the program of basic education is subject to under WAC 180-16-195

### J. ALTERNATE INSTRUCTIONAL DELIVERY SYSTEMS:

# Positive Case on School Campus and Quarantine Protocol for INDIVIDUALS

Students and/or staff identified as a close contact (see below) with an individual with a positive diagnosis will be contacted by text or School Messenger as well as with a follow-up by phone call if needed and directed to self-quarantine for 10-14 days or as determined by the Snohomish Health Department.

### Becoming a close contact occurs:

- Between masked students: within 3 feet or less for 15 minutes or more within a 24 hour period; or
- Between unmasked students, adults and students within 6 feet or less for 15 minutes or more in a 24 hour period; or
- Between unmasked adults and other adults: within 6 feet or less for 15 minutes or more within a 24 hour period

# Continuity of instructional plans for STUDENTS who are quarantined to ensure equitable delivery of the program of basic education

**Teachers** will prepare instructional activities for students and distribute materials and/or post student learning activities online. The online materials will be accessible through the teacher's Google classroom or See Saw sites.

**Technology** will ensure that all students who are quarantined have an appropriate device and accessible internet (hotspots, etc.)

**Food Services** will establish access to meals for students in quarantine.

**Contract Tracing Team** will notify families and individuals needing to quarantine.

# **Transition back to in-person:**

When the individual has been cleared of quarantine, they may return to the in-person classroom setting. A confidential list of quarantined individuals and dates they can return will be available to the site administrator.

## Positive Case on School Campus and Quarantine Protocol for CLASSROOM or CLASSROOMS

Quarantining a classroom may take place if:

- Directed by the Snohomish County Health Department and/or the Contact Tracing Team because they have determined that the close contacts are difficult to decipher; or
- The entire class was in close contact to a classmate/classroom teacher who reports a positive diagnosis and the students are unvaccinated; or
- The entire class was in close contact to a classmate/classroom teacher who reports a positive diagnosis and the students vaccinated are symptomatic; or
- The supervision of students is compromised due to teacher quarantining requirements

Continuity of instructional plans for STUDENTS who are quarantined to ensure equitable delivery of the program of basic education

**Classroom Teacher/s** will provide remote instruction through online instruction through zoom. Instruction will be delivered through synchronous and asynchronous formats.

**Technology** will ensure that all students who are quarantined have an appropriate device and accessible internet (hotspots, etc.)

**Food Services** will establish access to meals for students in quarantine.

**Contract Tracing Team** will notify staff and families/students needing to quarantine.

**Custodial Services** will implement appropriate sanitization plan to reduce risk of contagion.

# Transition back to in-person:

When the contact tracing team has determined that the quarantine period has ended, staff and students in the quarantined classroom/s may return to in-person learning.

CLOSING A SCHOOL

A school may be directed to closed by the Snohomish Health Department because of the rate of new positives in the community, hospitalizations rates, and transmission rates in the school: or

A school may be closed by the District because supervision of students is strained due to quarantine requirements.

All Classroom Teachers and Support Staff will provide remote instruction through online instruction through zoom. Instruction will be delivered through synchronous and asynchronous formats.

**Technology** will ensure that all students in the closed school will have an appropriate device and accessible internet (hotspots, etc.). They will coordinate and organize distribution centers for device pick-up if needed.

**Food Services** will establish access to meals for students in quarantine.

**Contract Tracing Team** will notify staff and families/students needing to quarantine.

**Custodial Services** will implement appropriate sanitization plan to reduce risk of contagion.

## **Transition back to in-person:**

The **Snohomish County Health Department** determines that the rate of new positives in the community, hospitalizations rates, and transmission rates in the school have dropped to a level where staff and students in the closed school may return to in-person learning.

# Positive Case on School Campus and Quarantine Protocol for CLOSING THE DISTRICT

The district schools would be closed if there was an Executive Order of the Governor that directs the entire district to close; or

The Snohomish Health Department determines the rate of new positives in the community, hospitalizations rates, and transmission rates in the schools and directs all schools to close; or

The district may close all schools because school supervision of students is strained due to quarantine requirements.

Continuity of instructional plans for STUDENTS who are quarantined to ensure equitable delivery of the program of basic education

All Classroom Teachers and Support Staff will provide remote instruction through online instruction through zoom. Instruction will be delivered through synchronous and asynchronous formats.

**Technology** will ensure that all students in the closed school will have an appropriate device and accessible internet (hotspots, etc.). They will coordinate and organize distribution centers for device pick-up if needed.

**Food Services** will establish access to meals for students in quarantine.

**Contract Tracing Team and Communications** will notify staff and families/students of the necessity to close all school campuses.

**Custodial Services** will implement appropriate sanitization plan to reduce risk of contagion.

## **Transition back to in-person:**

The **Governor** lifts the Executive Order to close the district or the **Snohomish County Health Department** determines that the rate of new positives in the community, hospitalizations rates, and transmission rates in the school have dropped to a level where staff and students in the closed school may return to in-person learning.
